The most important art collection of Seville is the Museum of Fine Arts. It holds many master works by many famous people such as Murillo and Valdes Leal.



Barcelona was rumored to be named after the Carthaginian general Hamilcar Barca, who is said to have found the city in the 3rd century BC.

The main sights to see are the Barri Gotic which is the center of an old city from the medieval times.

Lastly, the world-renowned Gran Teatre del Liceu opera house, which is for the performing arts.
